MINUTES OF THE 28th ANNUAL MEETING AND COMPACT LUNCHEON, 14 NOV. 2009 AT THE TO-RONTO CRICKET, CURLING AND SKATING CLUB

overnor Joyce Cutler opened the twenty-ninth Annual Meeting and Compact Luncheon by extending a warm welcome to both guests and members. She introduced our Guest Speaker, David Moore and his wife Deirdre to us and greeted Robert White, our editor and the Regent of the British Columbia Colony. Joyce then presented George and Elaine Nye from Red Deer Alberta to us saying how pleased we were to have members from different parts of Canada with us today.

MINUTES. On a motion by Dale Lahey, seconded by Keith Bain, the minutes of 15 Nov. 2008 were approved.

THE MAYFLOWER COMPACT. Captain (Dale Lahey) read the Mayflower Compact.

ANCESTOR'S ROLL CALL. Read by Debbie Clarke.

This year we have representatives from 20 Mayflower families with us today. This number includes descendants from, Elizabeth Fisher Hopkins, Mary Norris Allerton and Priscilla Mullins. John Billington's family and the descendants of William Brewster tied for first place both having 8 present. For the first time since I have been keeping these records there was a representative from the family of Edward Doty with us today.

NECROLOGY. Myrna Geldart. There were two deaths this year in our Society: Charles J. Howard died 10 June 2005 and our former Governor Mel Donald died 18 Sept 2009 at the age of 92.

VOTE ON BYLAW AMENDMENT

Joyce held the vote by the membership on the proposed amendment to our Bylaw Article VIII, section 2 (the Board shall meet approximately every 3 to 4 months to conduct Board Business.) The amended Bylaw was passed without objection. The revised Bylaw will now read "The Board shall meet as many times a year as is required to conduct Board Business." The 24 members present at the Banquet all voted in favour. In addition Joyce received 35 ballots through the mail from our members also voting in favour.

GOVERNOR`S REPORT. Joyce Cutler

Joyce announced the appointment of member
Connie Bryce as Assistant to our Historian Susan
Roser for a one year term.

Joyce informed us that Terry Smith had been elected as Regent of the Alberta Colony.

We will begin our celebration of the 30th anniversary of the founding of the CSMD on May 1, 2010 at the Cricket Club. Governor General Judy Swan

is coming. Judy is a dual member of the Canadian and California State Societies.

REPORT OF THE DEPUTY GOVERNOR. Susan Roser

Joyce and Susan attended the General Board meeting in Annapolis, Maryland in September; the report appeared in the fall newsletter so Susan said she would not repeat it. One item of interest however does bear repeating, she said. While we were there we talked to



Alice Teal and Harry Folger who are hard at work on the Mayflower Quarterly's diamond jubilee edition. It sounds like it's going to be a very interesting book, reprinting articles from quarterlies from the past 75 years. If you order before March 2010, you will save \$10 off the publication price. We have provided order forms on the tables so please take one home with you.

Susan thanked our Hospitality Committee – members Kathleen and Carol (and their daughters) who always

do such a great job manning the tables before the meeting and taking care of the name tags, raffle tickets and our sale items.

HISTORIAN'S RE-PORT. Susan Roser

We have 13 new members so far this year which means the count will be down considerably from last year's total of 25. Although the numbers are down, the number of applicants has not gone down. However they seem to require more help with difficult lines, which takes more time.

In the fall newsletter Susan advertised for an Assistant and Connie Bryce was one of those who responded. Susan

looks forward to having the help and working with Connie over the coming year. Since she anticipates our Colony Historians becoming more active in assisting their applicants, this alone may help to decrease her workload to the point where, at the end of one year, she may no longer need additional help.

At the General Board meeting in Annapolis we also learned that effective January 2010, applicants may apply for membership through women and children on the Mayflower, not just the men. Existing members may also file supplemental lines through any passenger.

Susan paid tribute to Mel Donald who died in September of this year. It was Mel she said carried us through after the sudden deaths of our first two Gov-

ernors. Our Society owes him a tremendous debt of gratitude.

REGENT OF THE BRITISH COLUMBIA COLONY. Robert White

Sadly, the BC Colony has gone into what we hope will be a temporary hiatus. After many years it has fallen victim to the following:

Geography – BC is a large area and the Colony was limited to the Vancouver area.

Demographics – Our greater Vancouver members are for the most part very elderly

Social Change—Young people tend not to join organizations such as ours—research is done on the Internet.

There is a small group meeting socially in Victory but they have no interest in taking on executive positions or re-forming the Colony on Vancouver Island.

CANADIAN PILGRIM. Robert White

Robert continues to edit this newsletter but the printing and the mail out are done in the Toronto area. Robert is very happy with this arrangement as it was a

considerable burden for one person to fold, stuff and post 300 plus newsletters.

A word about the newsletter content. In this regard Robert said he is the servant of the Board.

Some business copy is the same from newsletter to newsletter. Some is predictable such as the Governor's report. Some Robert finds himself and inserts as space allows.

Robert said he is happy to hear suggestions from the membership but he always runs a draft of the newsletter by Susan and others before it goes to print. Changes are approved by the Board and as he is so directed.

The business part of the meeting concluded Joyce asked Bob White to lead us in saying Grace. Joyce then asked Keith Bain to start off our luncheon with a toast to the Queen, which he did. We enjoyed an excellent meal. At the conclusion of our meal we held a raffle.

30th Anniversary Reflections by Susan E. Roser



here has the time gone? It seems like just yesterday that Hugh and I, along with my parents, attended the first Annual Meeting and Banquet of the Canadian Society – way back on 21 November 1981 in Toronto. Unfortunately, we had to leave immediately after dinner so missed out on the group picture. I was a very excited new member, my lineage was approved by Historian General Eugene Stratton the

previous month. Little did I realize then that this occasion would mark the beginning of my lifelong relationship with the Society and its members.

Like many of the early members, I learned of the Society through a story in a Toronto newspaper about Father James McGivern and his efforts to form a Mayflower Society in Canada. Father McGivern was tireless in his efforts, and on 18 October 1980, the General Society presented the charter to the Canadian Society.

We remembered our "Founding Father" at our 25th Anniversary in Plymouth in 2005 when we planted a tree in the gardens of the Mayflower Society House, with a memorial stone beneath it which said: "In Memory Of Father James S. McGovern who in1980 founded the Canadian Society of Mayflower Descendants. Tree dedication, 2005". I believe Father Jim would be pleased.

Father McGovern died unexpectedly in May 1982 and was succeeded by our second Governor, Col. Harry Pierce. In our 1982 newsletter he wrote:

"Our Compact exhorts us to transmit the spirit, the purity of purpose and steadfastness of will of our Pilgrim Fathers to those who come after us. We cherish the memory of those who kept alive the spirit so that we have a 'cause' that is honourable and respected by all who know of the *Mayflower* and those who were her passengers."

We lost Harry in August 1983, a scant fifteen months after the death of our first Governor. The loss of these two strong leaders was devastating and could have marked the end of our Society – but we were fortunate enough to have someone to pick up the pieces.

This person was Mel Donald. Mel became our Governor and until a meeting could be held, he also served as Deputy Governor, Historian and Treasurer. It was through Mel's gentle guiding hand that our Society was able to make it through this difficult period in our history. Mel served on the Board of Assistants continually, from 1980 until 2009 when he was our Elder.


We lost Mel a few months ago, in September 2009. We owe him such a debt of gratitude for the many years he gave of his time and generous spirit.

eith became a charter member of the Canadian Society when it was founded in 1980, along with his father, George Joseph Bain. He served as Captain from 1983 to 1988 and Governor from 1988 to

1991. Keith and his wife Helen, who reside in Ancaster, Ontario, have been familiar faces at our fall Compact Luncheons for thirty years. In fact, it is through Keith's membership in the Toronto Skating Curling and Cricket Club in Toronto that we are able to hold meetings at the club and we very much appreciate this wonderful opportunity. As found in our membership database, Keith talks a little about his search for his family history:

My interest in genealogy began after I made a trip to Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, with my parents when I was a teenager. I learned that some of my ancestors were among the first English settlers in Yarmouth County after the expulsion of the Acadians in 1755. Some summers after I was married, my wife and I would take our vacation in Nova Scotia so that I could work

on the history of the family. To my surprise this led me back to a total of five lines of Mayflower passengers William Brewster, Stephen Hopkins, John Howland, James Chilton, and Francis Cooke. I was accepted as a member of the General Society of Mayflower descendants in 1972, and was initially a member of the Michigan Society.


