

MINUTES OF THE 33th ANNUAL MEETING AND COMPACT LUNCH-EON, HELD 19 OCTOBER 2013 AT THE TORONTO CRICKET AND SKAT-ING CLUB.

n a motion by Cyndee Case seconded by Connie Bryce, the minutes of our last meeting which were published in our newsletter (volume 32 Number 1) were approved unanimously with one correction. The Mayflower Compact was read by Captain George McNeillie and the Ancestral Roll Call by Recording Secretary Debbie Clarke. The descendants of Billington, Alden, and Mullins were tied in first place with six members present. The Necrology was read by Elder Bob White and he asked for a moment of silence for four members who have passed away, viz: Bradley J. Baker, Alma D. Paul, Alfred Perry and Former Governor Keith Bain.

GOVERNOR'S REPORT, Joyce Cutler

I would like to welcome Bill Curry, as our new Regent for the Nova Scotia Colony. Bill has sent an email extending an invitation for the Canadian Society of Mayflower Descendants to hold our 34th Annual Meeting and Compact Luncheon in Nova Scotia, to help them celebrate their tenth anniversary in 2014. I have put a couple of sheets on your tables with this invitation. If you recall, we are having our Governor General, Bruce MacGunnigle for a Spring Meeting on May 3, 2014. We would like your feedback on this suggestion, so if you would let George or any other board member know what you think about this idea we would greatly appreciate it. The General Society 2020 Committee is holding a competition to create a Logo to celebrate the 400thAnniversary of the Sailing of the Mayflower, the Landing in Plymouth and the establishing of Plymouth Colony. The dead-line for this contest is April 15, 2014.

SECRETARY'S REPORT, Debbie Clarke.

The following are the Actions of the Board of Assistants which were approved as new policies at the meeting held August 24, 2013 at the North York Public Library.

Policy #4 Insignia is the property of the Canadian Society and must be returned once an officer retires from his or her office.

Policy #5 All officers Reports by Board members must be emailed to the Recording Secretary before each Board Meeting.

Policy. #7 The Secretary must notify the Elder and the Editor of deaths of members so the Elder can send a sympathy Card to the family and the Editor can publish the information in our newsletter.

Policy #8 The Librarian must up-date the web site when new material is added to our Library.

Policy #9 Starting in January 2014, the CSMD will use email exclusively wherever possible to communicate with its membership, applicants and prospective applicants, including distributing the Canadian Pilgrim

newsletter and that by the December 2014, regular mail will be used only for those members who do not use email or by request and will not be as an add on to what is sent by email.

Policy #10 The Treasurer will set up a CSMD PayPal account as an option for members, and applicants to pay dues, fees and annual meeting and compact luncheon and other costs securely online, rather than by cheque and that a PayPal link be added to the CSMD website to facilitate such payments.

Policy #11 In addition to the fall newsletter announcement, current members with email will be reminded annually on November 1st of the deadline to renew their CSMD membership for the following year and that regular mail is used to remind those members who do not use email.

Policy #12 the web address of the Canadian Society of Mayflower Descendants must be included in all business Correspondence sent by the Board of Assistants to create greater awareness of our organization.

We are working on three projects:

An application to the Canadian heraldic Authority for a grant of arms and badge; development of a Facebook page; and the launch of a Twitter site.

I have submitted an application on behalf of the Society to the Canadian Heraldic Authority and hope to have more to report by our spring meeting.

Our very talented IT director Margaret Dougherty has kindly offered to assist in developing our social media sites and has already launched our Twitter site @CanMayflower and this will be followed by the launch of our Facebook site next week. In terms of publicity, I am currently working on an article for the Globe and Mail on how I got involved in the search for my Mayflower ancestors and hope to have it published in time for American Thanksgiving. It is my hope that it will spur further interest in the Society and generate new members.

We hope to use the occasion of the visit of the Governor General of the General Society of Mayflower Descendants next May to generate some publicity and we will be striking a committee to develop a strategy.

Our new CSMD website, <u>csmd.org</u> went live in August. We hope that everyone here has had a chance to visit the site and that you find the information there helpful and informative. PASSING OF AMENDMENTS

ARTICLE II Section 1. The Board of Assistants (Corporate Board of Directors), hereinafter referred to as the *Board*, shall consist of the Officers of the Society and others who shall be known as Assistants or Members-at-Large, not to exceed twenty in total.

ARTICLE II Section 2. The Officers of the Society shall be: Governor, Deputy Gover-

He then paid tribute to our outgoing Governor, Joyce saying she has been the heart and soul of our society for the past ten years. He then led us in a round of applause to honour Joyce for her years of service to our society.

General Congress, Plymouth, Mass., Sept. 6-10, 2014

The General Congress of the General Society will be held in Plymouth, Mass., Sept. 6-10 where elections of new officers will take place. Our Historian Susan Roser has been nominated to serve a second term as Secretary General.

Counsellor Sandy Fairbanks of Nova Scotia will be attending as the Acting DGG (Deputy Governor General), and Former Governor Joyce Cutler will attend as AG (Assistant General). In Memoriam: Former Governor, G. Keith Bain

hen Keith heard that the Canadian Society had been formed in 1980, he and his father George, who had joined the Michigan Mayflower Society in 1972, immediately joined as charter, life members. Keith was elected Captain in 1983 and at our Annual Meeting

in 1988, he was elected as our fourth Governor.

In 1986, Keith began the process to have our society incorporated as a non-profit and by 1989 he succeeded when we received our Letters Patent from Consumer and Corporate Affairs Canada.

In his professional life, Keith was a city planner with the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs for thirty years. As director of the Policy Development Branch, he was responsible for formulating proposals for such important legislation as the Niagara Escarpment Act, the Ontario Heritage Act as well as major revisions of the Planning Act.

Keith and Helen would often spend summer vacations in Nova Scotia so that he could work on his family history. He was delighted to discover Mayflower lines back to Brewster, Chilton, Cooke, Hopkins and Howland.

Keith passed away in Hamilton, Ontario on October 9, 2013. We will miss seeing Keith and Helen at our meetings, which they attended faithfully for over 30 years.








Marion Tait

Robbins Roots

he Robbins family who have lived in Yarmouth town and county in Nova Scotia for over 250 years are descended from two brothers, James and Benjamin, who came from Plympton, Mass. in 1762 as New England Planters. These brothers were descended from Nicholas Robbins, who came to Massachusetts in

1635 with his family, part of the Great Migration. The origins of pioneer Nicholas in the Old World were not known to family historians, however, in an article in the October 2013 *New England Historical & Genealogical Register*, Chris Robbins of Fredericton, NB was

able to trace the origins of Nicholas back to Dover, Kent County, England. The Robbins family in Dover were mariners by trade, back at least to the 1500s; many Robbins descendants in Yarmouth, NS were mariners in the 1800s.

General Society of Mayflower Descendants Launches 2020 Logo Contest

The year 2020 will mark 400 years since the Mayflower sailed for and arrived in New 2020 Committee has launched a contest to

England. The GSMD 2020 Committee has launched a contest to create a logo to mark this important anniversary. The letter announcing the competition reads as follows:

"Your State Society and members are invited to join a competition organized by the GSMD 2020 Committee to create a national logo for the GSMD celebration of the 400th Anniversary of the sailing of the Mayflower, the landing in Plymouth and the establishment of the Pilgrim colony."

Incorporate your ideas for both the celebration of this event and perhaps the future marketing image of GSMD into a design that you believe would be an appropriate symbol. You may organize your effort in any manner you see fit.

In order to insure that good ideas are not excluded, there will be no limit to the number of entries a state or its members may submit. All entries for the contest should be received by the Chair of the 2020 Committee Logo Contest before April 15, 2014. An independent jury of marketing professionals will review each entry and recommend a base group to the committee. Five of those entries will be published in the June Issue of the *Mayflower Quarterly* and those who wish to vote may do so. The winner will be announced at the triennial meeting of the General Congress in September 2014.

All entries will become the property of the GSMD unless the applicant is notified otherwise. The General Society of Mayflower Descendants

The General Society of Mayflower Descendants, established in 1897, is the national organization of descendants of the passengers of the ship *Mayflower* that arrived in Plymouth, New England, in 1620 (note, there was no second voyage). Of the 102 passengers on board, there are twenty-six heads of families who have descendants (listed on the Society's website below) that are

recognized for membership in the Mayflower Society. The head of family represents his spouse and children who also came on the ship. For example, you may join the Society under the head of family, William Mullins, who also represents his wife Alice, son Joseph, and daughter Priscilla Mullins (who married passenger John Alden); or you may join under John Alden, who also represents his wife Priscilla Mullins. An individual with more than one Mayflower head of family may file supplemental lineages after the initial application is completed.

But when, after a voyage of fifty-four days, the *Mayflower* sighted land on November 9, 1620, the Pilgrims learned that storms had carried them off course and that they were beyond Virginia and the governmental authority that their original contract would have obliged them to honor. 


Nova Scotia Colony of the Canadian Society of Mayflower Descendants
